THE AUGUST 13, 2024, ELECTION IS A PARTISAN PRIMARY.

At a partisan primary, you may only vote for candidates in <u>one</u> political party. This has been the case since the early 1900s. Therefore, when you vote: Choose <u>ONE</u> political party in which you will vote, and vote for individual candidates within that party. *Warning:* Voting in more than one political party may void your voting choices.

VOTER REGISTRATION

Ashwaubenon residents may <u>register to vote</u> at the Office of the Clerk any time before 5 p.m. the Friday before Election Day, by mail 20 days prior to Election Day or online at <u>myvote.wi.gov</u> 20 days prior to Election Day. When registering ensure proper proof of residence is provided.

ABSENTEE VOTING BY MAIL

If you plan on absentee voting in the Fall Elections you can sign up for them now through myvote.wi.gov, fill out an absentee ballot application, send us a letter, or email us with your name, address, phone number, and where you would like the absentee ballot mailed. By choosing calendar year your request will include the August 13, 2024 and November 5, 2024 elections. Please provide a government issued PHOTO ID if not on file. Voters who meet the definition of Indefinitely Confined are not required to provide PHOTO ID. Absentee ballot requests need to be mailed or emailed at this time. By law, we can only accept hand delivered absentee ballot requests in the Clerk's Office the 14 days before an election (see dates and times below). Each person requesting an absentee ballot needs to have a separate request. By signing up now your ballot will be mailed to you as soon as we get the ballots.

ABSENTEE VOTING IN THE CLERK'S OFFICE

By State Law, absentee voting in the Clerk's Office is restricted to 14 days before an election and ends at 5 p.m. the Friday before Election Day. As a reminder, a government issued PHOTO ID is required.

If you plan on early voting here are the dates and times:

VOTER REGISTRATION ON ELECTION DAY

Residents may also register to vote on Election Day at their respective polling place. To confirm your polling location go to myvote.wi.gov. Polling locations are open on Election Day from 7:00 am - 8:00 pm. When registering ensure proper proof of residence is provided.

VOTING ON ELECTION DAY

As a reminder, when voting on Election Day, a government issued PHOTO ID is required.
