

FALL GENERAL ELECTION AND REFERENDUM

TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 3, 2026

VOTING BY ABSENTEE BALLOT BROWN COUNTY, WISCONSIN

Any qualified elector who is unable or unwilling to appear at the polling place on Election Day may submit a request to vote an absentee ballot to their municipal clerk. A qualified elector is any U.S. citizen, who will be 18 years of age or older on Election Day, who has resided in the ward or municipality where they wish to vote for at least 28 consecutive days before the election. The elector must also be registered to vote in order to receive an absentee ballot. Proof of identification must be provided before an absentee ballot may be issued*.

MAKING APPLICATION TO RECEIVE AN ABSENTEE BALLOT BY MAIL

Contact your municipal clerk and request that an application for an absentee ballot be sent to you for the primary or election or both. You may make written application to your municipal clerk for an absentee ballot by mail, by fax, by email or at MyVote.wi.gov. Or you may apply in person at the clerk's office during the In-Person Absentee Voting period listed on the following page. Your written request must include your voting address within the municipality where you wish to vote, the address where the absentee ballot should be sent, (if different from residency address), your signature and a copy of your photo identification*.

**THE DEADLINE FOR MAKING APPLICATION TO VOTE ABSENTEE BY MAIL IS:
5 P.M. ON THE FIFTH DAY BEFORE THE ELECTION, THURSDAY, OCTOBER 29, 2026**.**

*Voters who are indefinitely confined due to age, illness, infirmity, or disability may not be required to provide photo ID. If this applies to you, contact the municipal clerk regarding deadlines for requesting and submitting an absentee ballot.

**Special absentee voting application provisions apply to electors who are indefinitely confined, in the military, hospitalized, or serving as a sequestered juror. If this applies to you, contact the municipal clerk regarding deadlines for requesting and submitting an absentee ballot.

VOTING AN ABSENTEE BALLOT IN PERSON

You may also request and vote an absentee ballot in the municipal clerk's office or other specified location during the days and hours specified for casting an absentee ballot in person.

THE FIRST DAY TO VOTE AN ABSENTEE BALLOT IN THE MUNICIPAL CLERK'S OFFICE IS LISTED ON THE FOLLOWING PAGE. THE DEADLINE FOR VOTING AN ABSENTEE BALLOT IS ON THE SUNDAY BEFORE THE ELECTION, NOVEMBER 1, 2026.

No in-person absentee voting may occur on the day before the election.

The municipal clerk will deliver voted ballots returned on or before Election Day to the proper polling place or counting location before the polls close on November 3, 2026. Any ballots received after the polls close will not be counted.

NOTICE OF REFERENDUM ELECTION
STATE OF WISCONSIN
NOVEMBER 3, 2026

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that at an election to be held in the several towns, villages, cities, wards, and election districts of the State of Wisconsin, on Tuesday, November 3, 2026, the following questions will be submitted to a vote of the people pursuant to law:

QUESTION 1: “*Partial veto.* Shall section 10 (1) (c) of article V of the constitution be amended to prohibit the governor, in exercising his or her partial veto authority, from creating or increasing or authorizing the creation or increase of any tax or fee?”

QUESTION 2: “*Freedom to gather in places of worship during an emergency.* Shall section 18 of article I of the constitution, which deals with religious liberty, be amended to prohibit the state or a political subdivision of the state from ordering the closure of, or forbidding gatherings in, places of worship in response to a state of emergency, including a public health emergency?”

QUESTION 3: “*Governmental entity discrimination prohibited.* Shall section 27 of article I of the constitution be created to prohibit governmental entities in the state from discriminating against, or granting preferential treatment to, any individual or group on the basis of race, sex, color, ethnicity, or national origin in public employment, public education, public contracting, or public administration?”

This referendum ballot is a result of 2025 Senate Joint Resolution 116, 2025 Assembly Joint Resolution 10, and 2025 Assembly Joint Resolution 102. At an election in the Green Bay Area Public School District on Tuesday, November 3, 2026, the following question will be submitted to a vote of the people:

"Shall the Green Bay Area Public School District, Brown County, Wisconsin be authorized to exceed the revenue limit specified in Section 121.91, Wisconsin Statutes, by \$29,000,000 for the 2027-2028 school year, by \$36,000,000 for the 2028-2029 school year, by \$44,000,000 for the 2029-2030 school year, and by \$49,000,000 for the 2030-2031 school year, for non-recurring purposes including funding educational programs, staffing, and other operational expenses?"

Referendum Details

At an election in the Pulaski Community School District on Tuesday, November 3, 2026, the following question will be submitted to a vote of the people:

"Shall the Pulaski Community School District, Brown, Oconto, Shawano and Outagamie Counties, Wisconsin be authorized to issue pursuant to Chapter 67 of the Wisconsin Statutes, general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed \$59,800,000 for the public purpose of paying the cost of a school facility improvement project consisting of: construction of an addition and renovations at Lannoye Elementary School, including for classrooms, special education, and support spaces; renovations at Pulaski Community Middle School in Career and Technology Education (CTE), including Technology and Engineering Education, Agriscience, Family and Consumer Science, and Business and Information Technology classroom spaces, and conversion of the existing pool to a multi-purpose activity facility; construction of additions and renovations at Pulaski High School, including for a community swimming pool facility, a fitness/weight center, wrestling space, additions and renovations to Career and Technology Education (CTE) classroom spaces in select program areas, renovations to classrooms and labs, and construction of tennis courts and parking lot expansion; district-wide capital maintenance, building systems and site improvements; and acquisition of furnishings, fixtures and equipment?"

WHAT PHOTO IDS CAN I USE TO VOTE IN WISCONSIN?

State of Wisconsin Driver License



Can be expired since the last General Election

State of Wisconsin ID Card



Can be expired since the last General Election

Wisconsin Driver License OR State ID Card Receipt OR WI DMV ID Petition Process Photo Receipt



Valid for 45 days from the date receipt was issued
OR 60 days for the ID Petition Process Receipt

Veterans Affairs ID



Must be unexpired or have no expiration

U.S. Passport Book or Card



Can be expired since the last General Election

Student ID Card

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Enrollment Verification (If expired)



Valid for voting if the expiration date is no more than 2 years from the date the card was issued. If expired, must be accompanied with current enrollment verification

U.S. Uniformed Services



Can be expired since the last General Election

Tribal ID Card



Still valid for voting if expired

Certificate of Naturalization



Only valid for voting if Certificate was issued not more than 2 years before the date of the election
