

BROWN COUNTY NOTICE OF PARTISAN PRIMARY, REFERENDUM AND SAMPLE BALLOTS

TUESDAY, AUGUST 11, 2026

OFFICE OF THE BROWN COUNTY CLERK
TO THE VOTERS OF BROWN COUNTY:

Notice is hereby given of a partisan primary to be held in Brown County on August 11, 2026, at which the nominees for the offices named below shall be chosen. The names of the candidates for each office, whose nominations have been certified to or filed in this office, are given under the title of the office under the appropriate party, each in its proper column, together with the questions submitted to a vote in the sample ballot below.

Information to Voters

Upon entering the polling place and before being permitted to vote, a voter shall:

- state their name and address
- show an acceptable form of photo identification*
- sign the poll book**

***If a voter does not have acceptable photo identification, the voter may obtain a free photo ID for voting from the Division of Motor Vehicles.**

****If the voter is unable to sign the poll book due to disability, a poll worker may write the word "exempt."**

If a voter is not registered to vote, they may register to vote at the polling place serving their residence if the voter provides proof of residence.

Where ballots are distributed to voters, the initials of two inspectors must appear on the ballot. Upon being permitted to vote, the voter shall enter a voting booth and cast their ballot. The vote should not be cast in any manner other than specified here. Sample ballots or other materials to assist the voter in marking their ballot may be taken into the booth and referred to when voting. The sample ballot (if marked) shall not be shown to anyone so as to reveal how the ballot is marked. A voter who is a parent or guardian may be accompanied by the voter's minor child or minor ward. An election official may inform the voter of the proper manner for casting a vote but the official may not advise or indicate a particular voting choice.

Assistance for Voting

A voter may select an individual to assist in casting their vote if the voter declares to the presiding official that they are unable to read, have difficulty reading, writing, or understanding English, or that due to disability are unable to cast their ballot. The selected individual rendering assistance may not be the voter's employer or an agent of that employer or an officer or agent of a labor organization which represents the voter. If a voter is unable to state their name and address, an assistant may do so for the voter. **At the partisan primary, the voter shall select the party of their choice.** Voting for candidates of more than one party will invalidate the ballot. The voter must cast a vote for individual candidates of the selected party.

Where Optical Scan Voting is used

- If a party preference *is designated*, and votes are cast for ballot candidates of another party or write-in votes are cast in another party, only votes cast in the designated party will count.
- If a party preference *is not designated*, and votes are cast for candidates (or write-in votes are cast) in more than one party, no votes will be counted

Within the party of their choice, the voter shall fill in the oval next to the name of the candidate of their choice for each office for which they intend to vote. To vote for a person whose name does not appear on the ballot, the voter shall write in the name of the person of their choice in the space provided for a write-in vote and fill in the oval next to the write-in line. On referendum questions, the voter shall fill in the oval next to "yes" if in favor of the question, or the voter shall fill in the oval next to "no" if opposed to the question. When using the *electronic ballot marking device*, "Express Vote," to mark an **optical scan** ballot, the voter shall touch the screen or use the tactile pad to select the party of their choice. The voter shall then touch the screen at the name of the candidate of their choice for each office for which they intend to vote. To vote for a person whose name does not appear on the ballot, the voter shall type in the name of the person of their choice in the space provided for a write-in vote. On referendum questions, the voter shall touch the screen at "yes" if in favor of the question, or the voter shall touch the screen at "no" if opposed to the question.

Spoiled Ballots

If a voter spoils an **optical scan** ballot, they shall return it to an election official who shall issue another ballot in its place, but not more than three ballots shall be issued to any one voter. If the ballot has not been initialed by two inspectors or is defective in any other way, the voter shall return it to the election official, who shall issue a proper ballot in its place.

After Voting the Ballot

After an official **optical scan** ballot is marked, it may be placed in the provided security sleeve, so the marks do not show. The voter shall then insert the ballot in the voting tabulator and discard the sleeve. The voter shall leave the polling place promptly.

Referendum Election Details

At an election to be held in the Village of Wrightstown on August 11, 2026, the following proposed Resolution of the Village Board, will be submitted to a vote of the people:

WHEREAS, the Village of Wrightstown (“Village”) is authorized to exercise powers relating to municipal public utilities and public infrastructure pursuant to Wis. Stat. ch. 66 and other applicable Wisconsin law; and

WHEREAS, the Village Board has received information concerning potential large-scale data center development within or affecting the Village; and **WHEREAS**, such development may require or implicate substantial municipal utility infrastructure, public utility service commitments, water utility infrastructure, electric utility infrastructure, telecommunications infrastructure, roadway improvements, public facilities, and related capital expenditures affecting the Village and its residents; and

WHEREAS, proposed large-scale data center development may necessitate substantial telecommunications, broadband, Internet access, electrical, water utility, and related municipal infrastructure improvements within the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Village Board finds that public input regarding the Village’s participation in, support for, facilitation of, or approval of municipal utility and public infrastructure commitments associated with such development is necessary and appropriate; and

WHEREAS, Wis. Stat. § 66.0144 preserves municipal referendum authority otherwise specifically authorized by statute, including authority under Wis. Stat. § 66.0422(3)(b); and

WHEREAS, the Village Board desires to submit an advisory question to the electors of the Village concerning municipal utility infrastructure and public facilities associated with proposed large-scale data center development within or affecting the Village;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Village Board of the Village of Wrightstown, Wisconsin, as follows:

SECTION 1. REFERENDUM AUTHORIZED.

Pursuant to Wis. Stat. §§ 66.0144 and 66.0422(3)(b), the Village Board hereby directs that an advisory referendum be submitted to the electors of the Village of Wrightstown at the partisan primary election to be held on August 11, 2026.

SECTION 2. REFERENDUM QUESTION.

The ballot question shall read substantially as follows:

“Should the Village of Wrightstown authorize, support, participate in, or facilitate municipal utility infrastructure, public utility service commitments, public facilities, the operations of a facility for the providing of video service, telecommunications service, or Internet access service, directly or indirectly to the public or related municipal infrastructure improvements associated with a large-scale data center development within or affecting the Village?”

SECTION 3. ADVISORY NATURE OF REFERENDUM.

The referendum set forth herein is advisory only and is intended to obtain public input regarding municipal utility infrastructure and related public facilities associated with proposed data center development. The referendum shall not itself authorize any specific contract, expenditure, zoning approval, development agreement, or utility extension.

SECTION 4. NOTICE AND ADMINISTRATION.

The Village Clerk is directed to take all actions necessary to provide notice of the referendum and to cause the referendum to be conducted in accordance with Wisconsin election laws.

SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon passage and publication as required by law. Adopted this 27th day of May 2026.
